Top Two Challenges Over the Next 3-5 Years for the Profession

- A fundamental lack of basic grants management capacity by medium to smaller organizations (both government and non-government) and a lack of federal or other resources to address; and
- A lack of communication/coordination between federal grantors and recipient organizations.
